On the other hand, NLN is recognized as the voice of nursing and it has affected nursing practice in a number of ways. The organization has ensured that nursing students receive their training and education from professionals. It also conducts research on matters related to nursing education to help in

#### Role of the organization in nursing education

The World Health Organization is committed to improving institutional capacity for suitably skilled nurses to provide person-centered services. This consists of the provision of technical support for the development of nursing education plans to scale up competency-based education. The organization is focused on enhancing nursing training programs to meet shortages in the nursing workforce and new health-service needs. WHO works globally with countries and networks to implement different mechanisms to improve nursing education.

The National League for Nursing (NLN) also plays a significant role in nursing education by preparing all nursing faculty and nursing education leaders for the shared responsibility of teaching and promoting nursing care. The organization also develops support policies that provide nursing education programs with the appropriate faculty to teach the future nurses. NLN also advocates for funding to expand nurse faculty education programs that promote the development of faculty as educator-scholars. The organization also carries out leadership programs aimed at building education research capacity and develop a more diverse faculty workforce (Kalb, O'Conner-Von, Brockway, Rierson, & Sendelbach, 2015).

#### Role of the organization in nursing research

Both organizations play a significant role in nursing research. WHO support the funding of nursing research initiatives that promote the advancement of nursing theories. The World Health Organization also works with other organizations to promote research as well as the use of evidence based policy strategies for capacity building in healthcare.
